1st day of 3(three)-Day Block Level Mason's Training on Earthquake Resistant Construction Practices for Udharbond Development Block, Silchar Development Block, Borkhola Development Block, Salchapra Development Block, and Banskandi Development Block started on 13th February. Resource persons from NIT Silchar imparted training to the Masons of these blocks.



15th February 2025

In the presence of ADC-cum-CEO, DDMA, Cachar, the Mason Training Program for five development blocks—Barkhola, Salchapra, Banskandi, Udharbond, and Silchar was completed. With this, the training for all 11 blocks under the Cachar District has been successfully concluded. During the training of these 5 blocks, more than 100 masons received training on building materials and best construction practices, by resource persons from NIT Silchar and Assam University. Additionally, several private organizations participated, offering insights into construction material quality and marketing while showcasing their products and innovative features. The program concluded with a demonstration of earthquake-resistant structures by Field Officer, DDMA Cachar, followed by a session on LPG fire safety and disaster preparedness by the Fire & Emergency Dept. The event wrapped up with the distribution of certificates to the participants.



# Refresher Training

29th January 2025

A refresher training program for community volunteers on the Disaster Management Plan was conducted at SIPRD Udharbond under the banner of DPRC, SIPRD Udharbond. The training session began with an overview of basic disaster management concepts and their organizational framework. This was followed by a practical demonstration on the use of fire extinguishers, an introduction to SDRF norms, and discussions on response mechanisms. Volunteers also received hands-on training on handling of fire extinguisher, their usage and various improvised rescue techniques.

# 76<sup>th</sup> Republic Day Celebration



26th January 2025

On the occasion of the 76th Republic Day celebration, DDMA Cachar proudly secured the 2nd Position for presenting a thought-provoking tableau on the critical issue of climate change. A Meeting on Flood Response preparedness was conducted on 04/02/2025 in the Conference Hall of the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), Cachar. As part of the meeting, a training session was organized for the officers and officials of Agriculture, Fishery, and Veterinary Departments. Where an overview of the reporting mechanism, followed by hands-on training on the Sahayata Portal, ground-level reporting system developed by DDMA, Cachar to facilitate efficient and streamlined reporting was also demonstrated to the department representatives.

A visit and awareness session in connection with the preparation of the School Disaster Management Plan was conducted at Saidpur Janata High School & Kinnokhal HS School, Katigora RC.



# *Disaster Management Preparedness*



28th February 2025

DDMA Meeting in connection to to review the storm and flood disaster preparedness was held on 28th February 2025 . The meeting was chaired by the District Commissioner, Cachar, who assessed the preparedness of all individual departments in handling potential disasters, with a particular focus on flood protection measures and other emergency responses. During the meeting, the CFRC Portal was officially launched by the DC, Cachar, in the presence of Hon'ble MP, Silchar, and Hon'ble MLAs of Borkhola and Katigorah. This portal aims to streamline disaster response efforts and enhance coordination between departments and the community. Additionally, as per the instruction of DC, Cachar, DDMA officials presented a detailed briefing on the Sahayata Portal, which was introduced in 2024 immediately after the floods to assess damage to houses and other properties. The Sahayata Portal has played a crucial role in facilitating accurate and timely disaster damage assessment, ensuring swift relief and rehabilitation for affected residents.



During the meeting District Commissioner emphasized on the importance of ensuring that embankments, flood barriers, and drainage systems are in optimal condition before the onset of the monsoon season. The WRD was instructed to expedite any pending works and conduct regular inspections to mitigate flood risks effectively. Additionally, the availability of essential relief materials, including food, drinking water, medicines, and shelter supplies, was reviewed. The DC directed all concerned departments to maintain an adequate stock of these essential items and ensure their timely distribution in case of any disaster. The Health Department was asked to keep emergency medical teams ready, while the Food and Civil Supplies Department was instructed to ensure the availability of fodder if required by the Department of A.H. & Vety. The meeting also covered disaster response coordination, functionality of early warning systems, and inter-departmental collaboration to enhance preparedness. The DC urged all stakeholders to remain vigilant and proactive in disaster mitigation efforts, ensuring the safety and well-being of the residents of Cachar District. The meeting concluded with a commitment from all departments to strengthen disaster preparedness measures and work in coordination for effective disaster response.

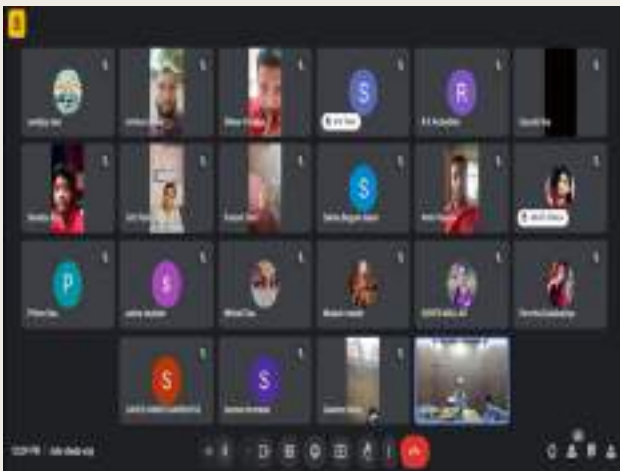
28th March 2025

# Response, Relief & Rehabilitation Activities

## 16th January 2025

At around 7:30 AM, a fire erupted in the Sadarghat area and upon receiving information, the Fire and Emergency Services (F&ESS) were promptly alerted. Fire tenders from multiple stations across the district swiftly responded to the scene and, with support from CQRT members, successfully brought the blaze under control. The fire impacted a portion of a residential complex and a commercial establishment. No casualties were reported in the incident.



## 28th January 2025

A fire incident was reported near the Malugram area which witnessed severe damage of properties. As an immediate measure, tarpaulins and utensils were distributed to the affected families. The affected families were ensured of all the necessary help that will be admissible to them as per latest SDRF norms.

## Minister Kaushik Rai leads flood preparedness, infrastructure review in Cachar

SILCHAR: Assam Minister Kaushik Rai chaired a high-level review meeting Thursday at the District Commissioner's office here in Cachar, studying officials to bolster flood defenses and fast-track infrastructure projects ahead of the monsoon season.

Rai, covering Flood, Public Distribution, Mines and Minerals, and Barak Valley Development, stressed a multi-faceted, proactive approach to mitigate flooding's toll. "The

government is fully committed to protecting Cachar's people," he said. "We must fortify embankments, upgrade drainage, and ensure sluice gates work flawlessly—no impact allowed." With Cachar prone to seasonal deluges, he directed departments to prioritise early action to curb waterlogging in vulnerable zones.

The meeting also tackled prevention of infrastructural damage, including sluice gate maintenance under the Water Resources Department, deciding in Silchar town, and

clearing stagnant water along Sonai Road—longstanding hotspots for residents. Rai underscored firm, uncompromising leadership, emphasising their agency. Discussion then shifted to major projects: the Garzon Bridge in Katigarih, the Borkhola-Kalin road under Assam Maha, and three Bharatnala initiatives. He pressed for quick resolution of delays, citing rural connectivity's role in economic growth.

Addressed by Utharbond MLA, Mr. Ranajit Boro, District Commissioner Mr. Midul Yadav, Sonai Road Development Organisation representatives, and senior officials, Rai underscored a dual focus: short-term flood control and long-term resilience. He pledged government support to enhance Cachar's flood readiness and urban modernisation, aligning with its rapid expansion.

The session ended with a firm commitment to timely interventions, ensuring the state's dedication to Cachar's safety and prosperity. As monsoon looms, Rai's pledge aims to shield the district while paving the way for sustainable development.

## Minister reviews measures to tackle flood in Cachar

SILCHAR, March 28: Minister for Food, Public Distribution and Barak Valley Development, Kaushik Rai, chaired a high-level review meeting here on Thursday to assess the preparatory measures to tackle flood situation.

Addressing the stakeholders in the meeting, Rai stressed the need for a well-coordinated, multi-departmental approach to minimise the devastating effects of floods.

The government led by Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma is committed to protecting the people of Cachar from the challenges posed by floods. We must ensure that all preventive measures are in place well ahead of time, leaving no room for lapses, he said.

The minister directed officials to work proactively in fortifying embankments, upgrading drainage systems, and ensuring the smooth operation of sluice gates to prevent water-logging and flooding in vulnerable areas. Besides flood preparedness, maintenance and functionality of sluice gates under the

Water Resources Department, desilting operations in Silchar town, and the clearance of stagnant water along Sonai Road—issues that have long disrupted daily life and mobility in the region were also discussed.

He underscored the need for immediate action on these fronts, instructing concerned departments to expedite remedial measures. The review meeting further delved into the progress of significant infrastructure projects, including the much-anticipated Garzon Bridge in Katigarih, the road construction from Borkhola to Kalin under the Assam Maha project, and three major projects under Bharatnala.

Rai pressed for swift resolution of any bottlenecks delaying these initiatives, highlighting the pivotal role of improved road connectivity in driving economic growth and regional development.
