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Cachar Gears Up for Monsoon Flood preparedness meet highlights unified strategy

ensuring sustainable long-term policies to address urban flooding. The remarks were made in an official statement issued after the visit. The Chief Minister visited six relief camps set up at Government Boys' HS School, Normal School, Kamrupa Vidyalaya Sikhar, Haveli Pooja Saha Manali, Umanil Mani at Mokra Bari, and UJL Bazar LF School.

Interacting with the flood-affected people at relief camps, Sarma took stock of the relief facilities and visited the Cachar Deputy Commissioner Bhishab Valley to ensure uninterrupted supply of essential commodities. He also directed officials to prioritise the needs of senior citizens, lactating mothers, and children, and to provide essential medical assistance and safe drinking water. While the Barak River continues to flow above the danger mark, the Chief Minister confirmed that no critical flood hazard has been reported so far.

He said the district administration is maintaining close surveillance on the situation. Explaining the cause of waterlogging in Sikhar, Sarma said that since gates, including the one at Brevakhand, could not be opened due to the rising water levels in the Barak, leading to water accumulation in low-lying areas. He indicated that ten pumps have been deployed to draw out floodwater and additional pumps will be installed if required.

He also proposed a permanent solution involving the construction of a dedicated pumping station and improved drainage infrastructure. Sarma said the state government is prepared to allocate additional funds, if necessary, to expedite the Brevakhand project. He stated that Water Resources Minister Piyush Hazarika is 30 days away from finalising the project.

The Chief Minister also announced that the Katapara Gauram Setu bridge project is scheduled for completion by July 15. During his inspection of the flood-affected Soibam Zone near Tapani Station along the Barak River, where initial foundation work had halted due to unstable soil, Sarma said deeper drilling would be undertaken to reach stable ground and facilitate the construction of a pedestal road.

The death has been reported as due to the flood. The Chief Minister thanked over 200 people for their support in the form of a meeting held in the conference hall of the Cachar Deputy Commissioner's office. Sarma was accompanied by Water Resources Minister Piyush Hazarika, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Minister Kishorendra Paul, Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Minister Kaushik Rai, MP Purnima Sahaibabha and several MLAs during the visit.

Minister Kaushik Rai reviews flood preparedness ahead of monsoon in Cachar

GUWAHATI, May 28: In a proactive drive to strengthen flood resilience ahead of the monsoon season, Minister for Food, Public Distribution and Consumer Affairs, Government of Assam, Kaushik Rai, chaired a high-level meeting on Wednesday at the new conference hall of the District Commissioner's office in Sikhar. The meeting was aimed at assessing and strengthening disaster preparedness across Cachar district, with a strong focus on flood mitigation, inter-departmental coordination, and ensuring public safety.

The session brought together a wide spectrum of stakeholders, including Cachar District Commissioner, Shri. M. Anil Kumar, Shri. Kanti Sharma, Deputy Commissioner, Piyush Hazarika, and Member Lok Sabha, along with senior officials from key departments concerned with disaster management, infrastructure, information, and water resources. At the heart of the discussion was the pressing need to ensure drainage infrastructure and avoid flood-related disruptions in Sikhar and adjoining areas, which have been identified by various insurance firms.

Minister Kaushik Rai under-

scored the urgency of adopting a proactive, rather than reactive, approach to flood management. He emphasized that flood preparedness must be viewed not just as a routine protocol but as a critical public safety measure. Directly and indirectly, he stressed the need for strengthening levee and infrastructure, ensuring the smooth functioning of drainage systems, operational status of check gates, effectiveness of embankments, and uninterrupted supply of essential commodities in vulnerable zones.

"Flood preparedness is not just a seasonal formality; it is a critical commitment towards safeguarding lives and infrastructure," he stated, urging officials to work in synergy to enhance ground-level readiness. Among the key directives issued during the meeting was the immediate inspection and readiness of the check gate located near the Government Bazar, with a call for seamless coordination with the District Security Force (DSF), the Executive Engineer of the Water Resources Department, and the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), ensuring swift corrective measures wherever required. Furthermore,

the Minister mandated the formation of an Inter-departmental Monitoring Committee by May 31 to keep a vigilant eye on river embankment conditions throughout the district. He also directed that schools be prepared to serve as temporary shelters in the event of flooding, institutions in this regard are to be looked by the Inspector of Schools and Circle Development Committees, ensuring that contingency plans are well in place at the grassroots level.

The meeting reinforced the government's long-praised approach to floods, emphasizing public health and hygiene. Minister Rai reiterated that the ultimate objective is to ensure timely and cost-effective response, a goal that demands collective vigilance, preparedness, and accountability from all sectors involved.
