THEMATIC MEETINGS ON FLOOD PREPAREDNESS



FOCUS ON RELIEF CAMP MANAGEMENT IN CACHAR.

A thematic meeting on Flood Preparedness under the theme, "Relief Camp Management" was held in the Conference Hall of Office of the District Commissioner, Cachar with line departments and all stakeholders. The meeting was attended by the CEO, Cachar Zila Parishad, CEO, DDMA & other Head of the concerned Departments.

ENSURING CONTINUITY OF SERVICES

As a part of flood preparedness in Cachar District, thematic meeting on Flood Preparedness related to the theme "Ensuring continuity of Services" held on 9th May of 2024 in D.C. Office Conference Hall, Silchar with all relevant departments and stakeholders viz. Education, Women and Child Welfare, Health & FW, A.H. & Veterinary, PHED, NYKS and IAG, Cachar etc. During the meeting All the departments were instructed to remain vigilant and keep their resources ready considering the need of the hour.





FOCUS ON CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IN CACHAR DISTRICT.

A thematic meeting on Flood Preparedness considering the theme “Critical Infrastructure Preparedness” was held in the Conference Hall of office of the District Commissioner Cachar. Representatives from PWD Roads, PWD Building & NH, NHAI, Water Resource, Irrigation, P&RD, Soil Conservation, Railways, Tele Communication, and Power Dept and including private telecom operators of Cachar District were present in the said meeting. The members were instructed to lay focus on critical infrastructure so as to avoid any of disruption of services considering the vulnerability that may arise during the entire monsoon.



REPORTING AND DAMAGE ASSESSMENT

To ensure smooth reporting and damage assessment mechanism and meeting related to the theme related to the theme “Reporting and damage assessment” was held on 21-05-2024 in the Conference Hall of the office of the District Commissioner, Cachar with all Departments and stakeholders viz. All CO's, PWD Roads/NH & Building, Irrigation, Vety. Dept, Agriculture Department, Handloom & Textiles Department, P & RD, and WRD, etc. Considering the importance of proper reporting and damage assessment post disaster, all this stake holders were given specific instructions regarding the mechanism to be followed during reporting and damage assessment.

COMMUNITY FACILITATION RESOURCE CENTER (CFRC)

In response to the devastating floods in Cachar District, Assam, a comprehensive identification of the thirty worst-affected Gaon Panchayats (GPs) was undertaken to prioritize relief and rehabilitation efforts. This process was essential in directing resources to the most vulnerable areas, particularly in the blocks of Borkhola, Katigorah, Kalain, and Tapang. Alongside this, a review was conducted of the twenty previously established Community Facilitation and Resource Centres (CFRCs) spread across ten blocks to assess their performance and effectiveness during the flood response. The CFRCs, a collaborative initiative between the Panchayat & Rural Development (P&RD) department and the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), with technical support from UNICEF Assam, have been central to disaster preparedness and community resilience. A crucial element of operationalizing these CFRCs has been the engagement of Nodal Officers from within the Gaon Panchayats. These Nodal Officers, including Tax Collectors, Gram RozgarSewaks (GRS), and Gaon Panchayat Coordinators (GPC), have been instrumental in leading the efforts to ensure local ownership and active participation in the operation of the CFRCs.



ORIENTATION PROGRAM ON CFRC ROLLOUT

An orientation program on CFRC rollout was held at Cachar Zila Parishad Conference Hall, Silchar on 7th May 24 to sensitize BDOs/ABDO's & other officials of Zila Parishad under the Chairmanship of the CEO, Zila Parishad, Cachar and in presence of CEO DDMA Cachar, Dy CEO Cachar ZP and other officials of the DDMA, Cachar & IAG, Cachar.



ORIENTATION PROGRAM FOR BLOCK DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS (BDOs)

A session emphasizing on the importance of improving disaster preparedness at block level by reviewing the impact of previous floods and showcasing the success of CFRCs in disaster response and resilience was held on 7th May 2024. Discussions highlighting the significance of collaboration between government agencies and the community through initiatives such as mock drills and joint efforts with non-government organizations were held during the sessions.



CFRC ACTIVITIES



TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR NODAL OFFICERS AND GAON PANCHAYAT SECRETARIES

The Nodal Officers' training was attended by 48 CFRC Nodal Officers and focused on enhancing their understanding of CFRC operations, disaster preparedness, and the integration of social protection schemes. Similarly, the GP Secretaries' training, which saw the participation of 84 individuals, focused on clarifying their roles in disaster management and ensuring the enrolment of vulnerable communities in social protection schemes while promoting effective disaster response

TRAINING PROGRAM ON ENHANCING ACCESS TO SOCIAL PROTECTION AND DISASTER ASSISTANCE.

One-day training of CFRC Nodal Officers & GP Secretaries of P&RD, Cachar on the role of CFRCs in enhancing access to social protection and disaster assistance was held on 9th May'24 at Cachar Zila Parishad Conference Hall Silchar.. The Program was inaugurated by the CEO, Cachar Zila Parishad in the presence of officials of Zila Parishad Silchar, DDMA, Cachar, and IAG, Cachar.





INFORMATION GATHERING AND COMMUNITY MAPPING

To enhance disaster preparedness, extensive drills were conducted across various Gaon Panchayats (GPs) to gather vital information and create detailed profiles for each community. Selected volunteers from the CFRCs undertook Community Resource and Vulnerability Mapping, where they identified local resources, potential hazards, and vulnerable populations. These volunteers engaged with community members to gather essential contact numbers, which may prove critical for coordinated responses during emergencies. This comprehensive mapping not only facilitated better understanding of community dynamics but also laid the groundwork for informed decision-making in disaster management.

EARLY WARNING SYSTEMS

The establishment of early warning systems was pivotal in improving community responsiveness. A WhatsApp group was created to disseminate timely updates regarding water levels and weather forecasts, ensuring that community members remained informed about potential threats. This digital platform encouraged active participation, with members sharing real-time information about changing conditions in their areas. The immediacy of these alerts allowed residents to take necessary precautions, such as relocating to safer areas or preparing emergency supplies, thus significantly reducing vulnerability during disasters.

DISTRICT-LEVEL CONSULTATION TO ADDRESS THE ENTITLEMENTS AND CHALLENGES FACED BY PWDS IN DISASTER-PRONE AREAS.

The meeting brought together 51 participants from various departments and organizations and resulted in several key outcomes. These included a comprehensive vulnerability assessment identifying the specific needs of PWDs, the development of an action plan to ensure better inclusion of PWDs in disaster management, and department-specific recommendations for improving accessibility in schools, conducting health screenings, and enhancing the provision of relief camp facilities for PWDs. These initiatives underscore the critical role of disaster preparedness, emphasizing community involvement and collaborative planning to mitigate disaster impacts. The CFRCs are integral to connecting communities with disaster management authorities, ensuring timely responses, and supporting marginalized populations like PWDs. This comprehensive approach aims to create a more resilient and inclusive disaster management framework for Cachar district.





During the onset of disasters, the CFRC committees played a crucial role in realtime disaster reporting. Committee members provided updates on the situation within villages, including the displacement of individuals and the establishment of new relief camps. This information was meticulously documented and forwarded to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) by the Circle Quick Response Team (CQRT). The prompt reporting enabled the DDMA to allocate relief resources efficiently, ensuring that aid reached those in need without unnecessary delays.

RELIEF CAMP MANAGEMENT

The management of relief camps was a critical function during the 2024 floods. CFRC committees continuously updated real-time data regarding the number of individuals taking shelter in recognized relief camps. They coordinated closely with concerned Revenue Circle Office and CQRT members to ensure the timely distribution of relief materials, which included food, water, and essential supplies. The committees also collected necessary documents for reporting and resource allocation. Recognizing the need for comprehensive support, efforts were made to ensure the availability of water, sanitation facilities, health camps, and psychological support, which were provided by Anganwadi Workers (AWW). Local NGOs played a vital role in maintaining order and ensuring that rations were distributed fairly to those displaced.



DAMAGE REPORTING

The CFRC committees were instrumental in damage reporting. They collected and finalized damage reports during committee meetings, which detailed the extent of destruction caused by the floods. These reports were then submitted to the circle office through the Block Development Officer (BDO) for compensation under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) norms. Additionally, the committees assisted in gathering Gratuitous Relief (GR) data during the flood relief distribution process, ensuring that accurate and comprehensive information was available for government assessments and relief allocations.

SOCIAL PROTECTION SCHEME IMPLEMENTATION

The CFRCs also played a significant role in implementing social protection schemes. The Gram Sevak utilized the CFRC group to disseminate information about various agricultural schemes available to the community. Copies of pending lists for schemes such as the Agriculture Based Pension Scheme (ABPS), eKYC, and Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi self-declarations were shared among community members and distributed by Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) members. This outreach helped ensure that eligible beneficiaries were informed and able to apply for the assistance they required. The Gram Panchayats actively sought the support of CFRC management committees to identify eligible individuals holding E-shram cards for applying for ration cards, in line with government directives. Moreover, the CFRCs facilitated the collection of Aadhaar cards for Aadhaar seeding and gathered other essential community information. A notable initiative was undertaken by the Tarinipur CFRC management committee, which conducted an awareness program on the Pradhan MantriFasalBimaYojana (PMFBY) in collaboration with HDFC Bank staff, who provided guidance on the application process.



MEETING HELD WITH CFRC MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEMBERS

A meeting with CFRC management committee members was convened in the office of Rajatilla GP under Katigorah Revenue Circle where the roles and responsibilities of the committee members were thoroughly discussed. Moreover, the members were also asked to perform their duties as assigned so that the CFRC could prove to be beneficial as a community-centric initiative.



LIGHTNING AND THUNDERSTORM DO'S AND DON'TS FOR ANIMALS

- Designate a safe area in or near your home to shelter your animals in a severe thunderstorm.
 - Keep your animals away from open water, ponds, or rivers.
 - Keep your animals away from tractors and other metal farm types of equipment.
 - Watch your animals closely and try to keep them under your direct control.
- Don't allow your animals to congregate under trees.

SILCHAR, May 11: In a bid to check the flood situation during the monsoon in Cachar district, the district administration in association with district disaster management authority (DDMA) held a review meeting on preparedness to combat the flood situation.

The meeting was presided over by the Chief Executive Officer of DDMA, Cachar, Yashraj Borahkar. He reviewed the preparedness plan for 2024-25, block level flood preparedness, and departmental preparedness for flood management. He also reviewed the need for such department to prepare based on past flood experience.

SILCHAR: In a bid to clean drains and sewerage channels to mitigate the problem of flash flood in Silchar, the district administration has sought the co-operation of the local citizens of Rangirkhal, Singirkhal and Longaikhal, specifically those who have built constructions / RCC slabs / temporary structures over the connected drains to clear the built structures within June 30. A notice was issued in this regard by district commissioner Rohan Kumar Jha on Wednesday. The notice

said during field visits to Rangirkhal, Singirkhal & Longaikhal, it has been observed that some of the inhabitants of the aforesaid localities have constructed RCC slab structures / temporary bamboo structures / extensions over the connected drains without keeping provision of manhole thus putting obstructions in cleaning and clearing of drains. It has also been observed that due to siltation of drains there is blockage of the natural flow of water through the natural drains, triggering artificial flood, persistent water logging during rainy days in those areas and thus there is an immediate need for taking necessary steps to keep the natural drainage system free from any blockage for ensuring smooth and natural flow of storm water during the rainy days to avoid artificial flood or water logging in different parts of the Silchar town, the notice by DC Jha stated. Further, the DC, who is also the chairperson of the district disaster management authority (DDMA) directed the citizens to clear the built structures within June 30. The constructed structures will be razed if the order is not followed within that date, the notice stated.
